Medal haul by Jared Solomon



garuawahia Hiah School's Jared Solomon was one of five Waikato swimmers who returned from the national age group swimming championships in Christchurch with medals.

Jared swims for the Ace Swimming Club at Te Rapa Waterworld and took gold in both the 14 year old boys' freestyle and butterfly.

He also won bronze medals in the 100m backstroke, 50m freetsyle and 100m butterfly in his age group, breaking a Waikato record in the 50m freestyle with a time of 25.70s.

Jared qualified for 10 races, swimming in nine and making seven finals. He also swam in the Waikato 15 years and under medley relay team, which made the final and finished fifth.
