






# BACKGROUND TO THE UNITED KINGDOM INVITATION



Whilst visiting New Zealand in March 1977, Mr Nicholas Braithwaite, the Guest Conductor for the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra was invited to hear the Ngaruawahia High School Maori Cultural Group perform.

Mr Braithwaite was accorded a special Maori welcome at the school prior to hearing the Cultural Group. Following the school's performance of Maori traditional songs and dances, he was invited to view the Turangawaewae Marae, where he was shown the various Maori treasures and cultures, as well as the Marae way of life, which is the priceless gift of the Maori people.

Mr Nicholas Braithwaite is recognised in musical circles as one of Britain's leading orchestral conductors — his record as shown elsewhere verifies this statement. In his opinion the Ngaruawahia High School Cultural Group was one of the most talented entertainment groups he had ever heard. Combined with this, the Maori culture which Mr Braithwaite had now personally experienced was something, in his opinion, the world would be privileged to see and hear.









On his return to Great Britain, Mr Nicholas Braithwaite recommended to the International Festival of Youth Orchestras and the Performing Arts that the Ngaruawahia High School Maori Cultural Group be invited to represent New Zealand at the Annual Festivals to be held in August 1978, at Aberdeen, Scotland, and London, England.

Mr Braithwaite's recommendation was immediately accepted by the International Festival Committee and and invitation from their President, the Rt Hon. Edward Heath M.P. was sent to New Zealand for the Ngaruawahia High School Group to attend and to represent our country at this Nationally representative Festival.

After discussions by a committee comprising the Ngaruawahia High School Board, the parents, and a group of responsible citizens, it was decided unanimously to accept this prized invitation. They committed themselves to the raising of \$60,000 to finance the tour.













#### THE COMMITTEE TOOK INTO ACCOUNT THE FOLLOWING FACTS:



- [1] Mr Nicholas Braithwaite's sound musical judgement and opinion of the standard of the Group.
- [2] The immediate acceptance of his judgement by the International Festival Foundation in London.
- [3] The high standard of musical and cultural training available at Ngaruawahia High School which arises from the close co-operation between the school and the Marae. This results in the Group conforming with the highest world standards.
- [4] The many benefits to New Zealand of the visit of such a group overseas. The Group will perform to approximately 50,000 people over a period of three weeks.
- [5] The 32 parents and their children's committment to raise \$600 each as their contribution to the tour.

# My Righolas Byaithwaite



A superior Orchestral Conductor, he is the talented son of a distinguished musical family.

He was born in London, Educated in Bedales where he had two years as principal trombonist with the National Youth Orchestra of Great Britain.

# International Festival Foundation

The festival is controlled by the International Festival of Youth Orchestras Foundation of Great Britain with the support of the British Tourist Authority, and the Corporation of the City of Aberdeen.

The President of the Festival Committee is the Rt Hon. Edward Heath — some of the other prominent people associated with the festival are Leonard Bernstein, Walter Sussking, Leon Gousens, and Thor Heyerdahl.

The aim of the organisation if to bring together youth from all nations of different backgrounds, religions, races, and political beliefs, to encourage harmonious living together with the common interest of music and performing arts.

A major aim of the festival is to promote International understanding amongst the youth of the world and to encourage respect and tolerance for one's fellow man.

This year is their tenth anniversary celebration, when a special effort is being made by the foundation to involve even more countries of the world in the festivities. Some of the many countries represented at the festival are:

#### The Cultural Group


The group was formed in 1975 as a natural development from courses in Maori Studies which have been instituted and provides pupils with an opportunity to develop their talents as a performing group. It has also served to develop a very harmonious relationship between the school and the Turangawaewae Marae.

A group of musical teachers from Ngaruawahia, both Maori and European, has all assisted to bring the group to the high standard they have now achieved.

The group will be assisted by Rev. Kingi Ihaka; to maintain their high standard for thier performance at Aberdeen which will consist of many shows, each of 80 minutes duration. With the added performances in London, we anticipate the group will be heard by over 50,000 people.

The group is very polished in their performance – all of them have close association with Maori music and culture. Two members of the group are grandsons of the famous New Zealand baritone, the late Inia Te Wiata.

The overall management of the group is controlled by Mr Warwick Braithwaite, a teacher at Ngaruawahia High School. His experience and musical ability which is widely recognized in the Waikato will be of great assistance to the general presentation.







The group realise they are ambassadors for New Zealand.

They will represent our country in the highest Tradition of New Zealand.

On their return home, they will continue to perform and pass on their benefits of their international experience to all people, knowing the Maori culture will live on forever.

The convenors of each of these committees are experienced and capable members of the community — each with a specialised knowledge of their group's requirements.

### **Fund Raising**

The tour party will comprise of 40 people, (32 pupils aged between 15 and 19 years of age, and 8 adult supervisors).

On arrival in Great Britain, the Concert Party will perform in London, prior to the festival commencing in Aberdeen. Accommodation, performance fees and grants will be provided during the period of the New Zealand Contingent's stay in the British Isles.
